Charron & Pine Hill Rd

Reconstructing the drainage and adding the turning lane to deal with the backup of traffic on Charron and paving both streets have gone a long way in making this intersection function better. However with the added traffic from the work completed on Amherst Street and the popularity of Broad Street Parkway the increase in traffic was causing a great deal of difficulty for many drivers.

We were faced with two possible outcomes for this intersection, the first being a three-way stop and second a new traffic light.

The first solution would take people a little while to understand but, like other three-way stops in the city, it would be successful. The other option of putting in a traffic light would change the entire area. Traffic lights can stop
